2018 NCPP Workshop Application (Deadline June 25, 2018)

Phoenix Gayle and Vincent Cianni in coordination with Newburgh Community Photo Project (NCPP) presents EveryDay Newburgh, a safe space for teenagers and young adults to develop a wide range of narratives on poverty, water and housing, substance abuse, gender and sexual identities, and other social-political issues affecting their lives to raise awareness through photography and advocacy to become powerful voices in their community. Selection is by application and interview. A select number of teens and young adults in the City of Newburgh will be offered **ten (10) free workshops from 10am to 3pm every Saturday from July 7 to September 15, 2018 (except Labor Day weekend) and a \$500 stipend.**

EveryDay Newburgh and NCPP will provide a healthy and nutritious lunch to workshop participants each week. The workshops are taught by working professionals in the field of photojournalism and documentary photography and will cover technical basics of digital photography, audio, and video as well as visual storytelling, recording interviews, and developing photo essays through instruction, critique, feedback, discussions, presentations, and readings. **Cameras will be provided.** At the completion of the project, workshop participants will exhibit their work in exhibitions, installations and public art projects opening on September 29, 2018 as part of Newburgh Open Studios. **Each participant will be given a \$500 stipend on the successful completion of the workshop and exhibitions.**

Participation in the workshops is by application/interview only. Interested applicants should be 16 to 24 years old, a resident of the City of Newburgh, and meet income guidelines as required by ESPRI, the granting body. Early deadline is June 14; early interviews are Saturday, June 16. Final interviews are June 30, 2018. Notification of acceptance will be no later than July 2, 2018. Workshops begin July 7, 2018.

FAQs

What will I learn during the workshops?

-Participants will develop camera, audio, and photojournalism skills to help identify and amplify community issues that need change. Classes focus on media technology, ethics, methodology and professional practices, journalism, interviewing, photo and audio editing.

Do I need experience?

-No experience is needed.

What is the interview about?

-The interview is part of the application process. Applicants will meet in-person with program coordinators to discuss their interest, availability, and commitment to the project. Early interviews are June 16, 2018; final interviews are June 30, 2018. See front for early and final application deadlines.

What is the workshop structure?

-Workshops are held every Saturday from July 7 through September 15 (excluding Labor Day weekend) from 10am - 3pm. Lunch is provided from 12pm - 12:45pm. Participants are expected to practice learned skills during workshop time and when workshops are not in session. During the workshops participants will generate material to create an exhibit that will be open to the public and part of the City of Newburgh OPEN Studios, September 29-30.

Where are workshops held? How do I get there?

-Almost all workshops are held at the NCPP project space ([102 South William Street](#)) in Newburgh. Transportation is not provided. The closest Newburgh bus stop is Broadway and Liberty. NCPP is 5 blocks south from this stop. Some workshops will be held at Mount Saint Mary College campus. Transportation will be provided to/from the campus to NCPP.

What is the time commitment?

-*Participant availability is important.* Participants must be available for the initial interview during the application process. Participants are required to attend the ten sessions on the indicated Saturdays from 10am-3pm. *Participants must arrive 15 minutes before the workshops begins* and be present for the entire workshop. Participants must sign in for each session. Participants must be able to complete homework assignments. Participants should make every effort to be available for opening night of exhibit on September 29.

When do I receive the stipend?

-The stipend is issued after the workshop series. The \$500 stipend is based on successful completion of the workshop and attendance at all sessions. Unexcused absences will jeopardize participant's continuation in the series and/or their receipt of the stipend. (Only emergencies and/or previously scheduled family functions will be accepted for absences.) Partial stipends will be considered for emergencies.

Do I need a camera?

- **Cameras will be provided to participants.** However, participants are encouraged to bring their own digital SLR, compact, or hybrid camera or high quality cell phone camera.
